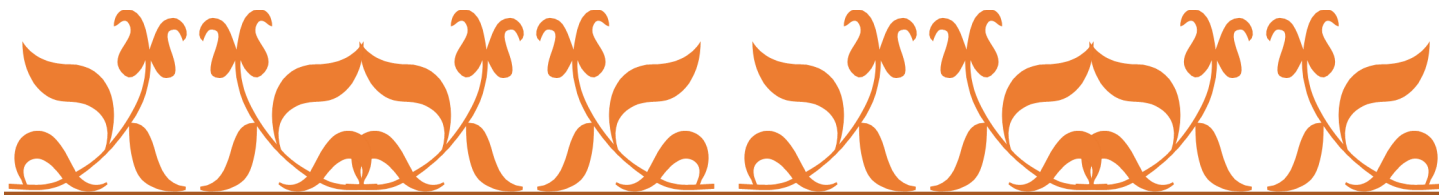



# Apple Spice?

Fall is ending but what is getting closer is Thanksgiving. And what is the most giving thing like sharing a bottle of cider? Sparkling cider? Apple juice?! Apple cider vinegar?! The questions that have tormented generations of apple lovers have magically appeared, so what is this difference between cider and juice? What tastes the most festive and which is the best.

The difference between cider and juice is the easiest to answer. Cider is made through a process of cleaning, cutting and mashing apples into, well, a mash. This mash is then pressed into a juice which doesn't go through filtration. Juice however gets filtered and pasteurized which causes it to last longer than it's perishable cider brother. Cider can also get fermented into hard cider. It would also be good to

note that a drink being sparkling is that it is carbonated. Carbonation is adding carbon dioxide gas to a liquid, an example is soda.

Now, for the festive and best part. I decided to get a couple of apple drinks and taste them out. Those being sparkling cider, cider mix (I couldn't find any premade cider), sparkling apple juice, apple juice and unfiltered apple juice, as a treat! After you cut it you will have an amazing treat that you just made.





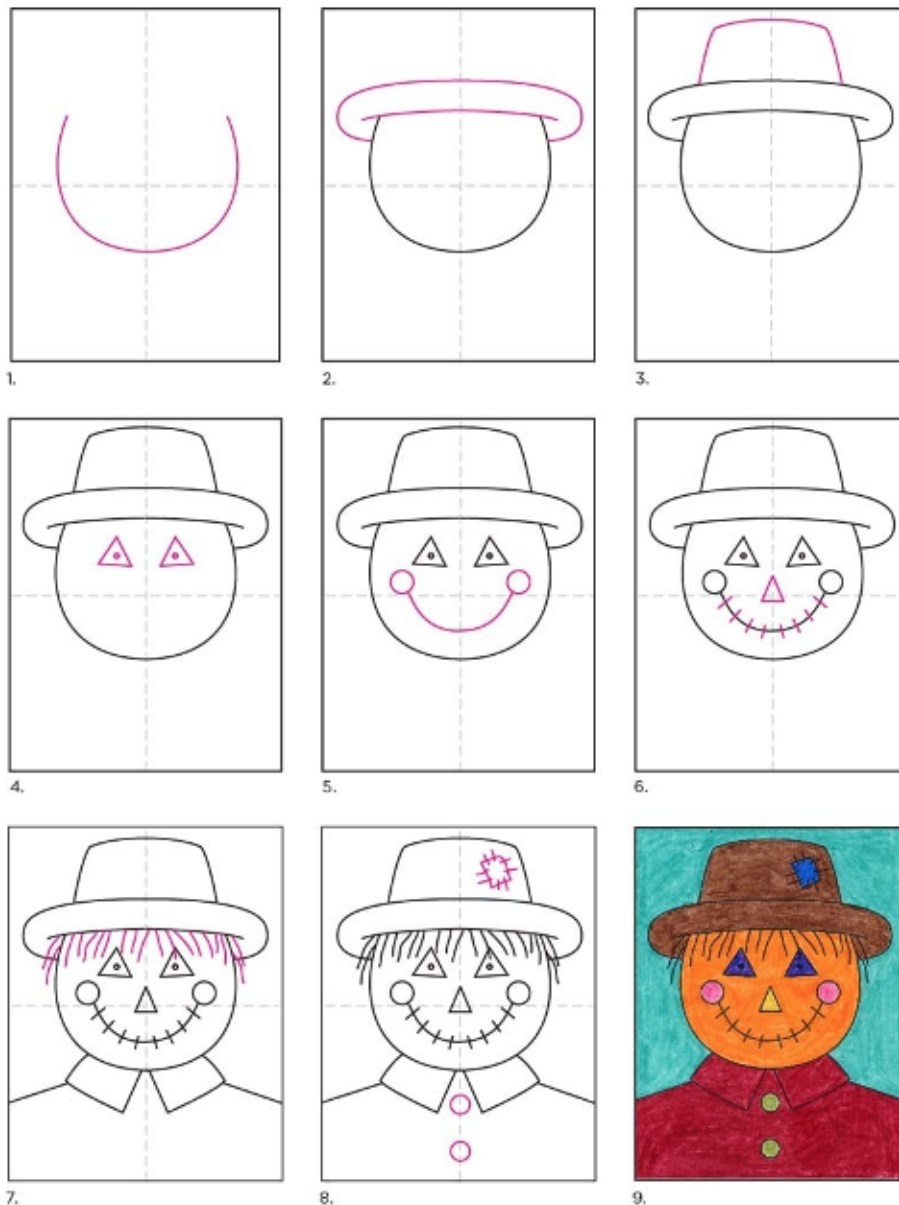
